


AURORA ACADEMIC CHARTER SCHOOL PARKING UPDATE

GRADE 6 & 9 IMMUNIZATIONS



May 12, 2021

Each year, Alberta Health Services (AHS) Public Health School Immunization Program reviews immunization records for students in Gr.1, 6 & 9 and provides recommended program vaccines.

Though School Health Nurses have been supporting the COVID-19 Clinics, we are also working to provide **regularly scheduled program** vaccines to school-aged children.

Woodcroft Public Health Centre (inside Westmount Shopping Centre, Groat Road and 111 Avenue, 780-342-1600, option 3) is the designated health centre for your child's school. As time permits, School Nurses from Woodcroft will either contact you directly or contact the school about upcoming immunization opportunities for program vaccines.

Albertans born in 2009 or earlier are also eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine.

How soon before or after another vaccine (including Influenza vaccine), can an individual receive COVID-19 vaccine?

At this time, it is recommended individuals wait at <u>least 28 days after the administration of a dose of COVID</u>-19 vaccine to get another vaccine, including the influenza vaccine. It is also recommended to wait a period of at <u>least 14 days after the administration of another vaccine</u>, including the influenza vaccine, before getting a COVID-19 vaccine.

What if an individual has had another vaccine within 14 days and presents for COVID-19 vaccine?

If the individual requests and consents to the COVID-19 vaccine after being informed of the lack of evidence with timing of other vaccines, the <u>COVID-19 vaccine may be administered</u>.




